Program Descriptions

Tutoring, Remediation & Enrichment

Three students per class • Grades 1-12

After a formal complementary educational evaluation with the students, and consultation with the parents, an individualized program is designed for each student. We limit our class sizes to three students to ensure that our staff is able to attend to the specific needs of each child. The subjects covered can include Mathematics, English, Sciences, Social Sciences, ESL, and Reading Readiness (JK/SK).

Skill Builders

Four students per class • Grades 6-12

Building Organizational and Study Skills: Learn time management, scheduling, goal setting, note taking, test preparation, report writing, methods of following directions and improving memory.

Write the Perfect Essay: Develop the necessary skills to write an effective essay in several formats by being guided through all the steps of the writing process.

Developing Keyboarding Skills: Students are provided with lessons, practice sessions and games to focus on building essential keyboarding skills.

Course Review or Preview: Prepare for an upcoming course by reviewing or previewing the course content in all subject areas.

Foundation Skills for High School

Up to six students per class – For students entering Grade 9

Get maximum preparation for high school English and Mathematics by reviewing the essential skills to ensure success.

High School Credit Courses

Most subject areas • Four students per class • Grades 9-12

As an Independent School, inspected by the Ontario Ministry of Education, Chisholm offers students the opportunity of completing a new course or upgrading a mark. We offer courses in most subject areas and follow the Ontario Curriculum, supplemented by enrichment or remediation as required. Our courses are interactive and monitored on a regular basis by a program coordinator. Transcripts are forwarded to the student's home school for inclusion in the official school record. Chisholm also offers a traditional full-time Academy High School.

Standardized Exam Preparation

Three students per class

SSAT: Preparation for the private school examination required for students applying to many Independent Schools (Lower Level - Grades 5, 6,7 and Upper Level - Grades 8, 9, 10, 11).

SAT: Entrance Examination Preparation for students applying to Post Secondary Institutions in the United States.

Grade 10 Test of Literacy: Preparation for the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) required for completing High School.
